I provide a variety of art-based projects and activities along with corresponding and connecting resources. These projects and activities provide students with the choice to create in a wide range of media including drawing, sculpture, painting, and collage while also introducing students to a body of diversified traditional and contemporary working artists related to each assignment. All projects and activities have an interdisciplinary connection so that students are challenged in multiple subject matters and receiving a well-rounded art education.

As I created this document, the students were of utmost importance. While I overcame challenges of my own during this process such as technology-related issues, I kept going and striving to achieve my goal. That is what we all need to do even during these difficult days when time seems to almost stand still. Why did I do this? I did it for my students - so they can receive the quality art education they deserve even in the most unfortunate of circumstances. I hope these projects and activities stimulate divergent thinking, give students a creative outlet to escape, and inspire art-making through self-expression during this time.
